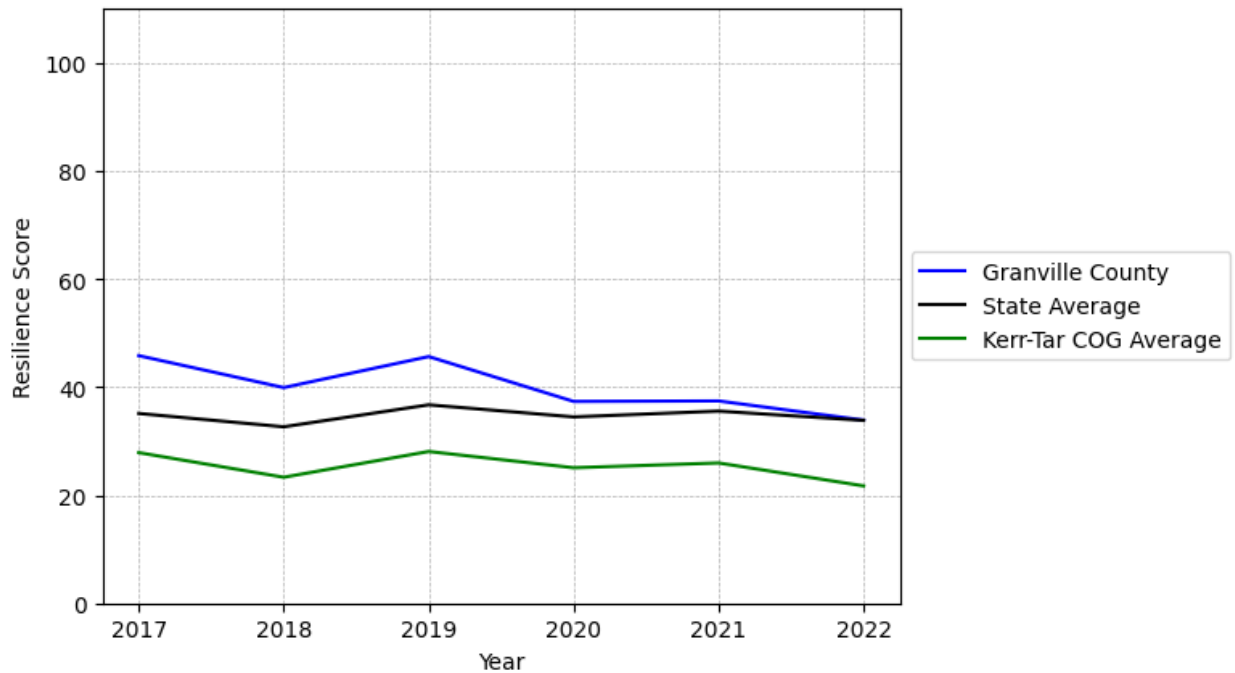


Granville County Summary

Resilience Score: 33.88

In 2022, Granville County achieved a Resilience Score of 33.88, which is average as compared to the North Carolina State average.

Note: Resilience Scores are normalized from 1 to 100 with the most resilient county scoring 100. The Resilience Score is determined based on a county's performance relative to NC's other 99 counties.

Granville County's Resilience Score is comprised of 9 distinct dimensions of resilience. Below are Granville County's scores for 2022 on those 9 dimensions, and their rank relative to other North Carolina counties.

Business Community Health: 15.9

This component examines the strength and diversity of the local business community, including factors such as the number of businesses, employment levels, and industry diversity. Granville County's performance on this dimension is average when compared to other North Carolina counties, ranking 26th in the state.

This component looks at the financial health of local governments, including their ability to generate revenue, manage debt, and maintain adequate reserves to weather economic downturns. Granville County's performance on this dimension is average when compared to other North Carolina counties, ranking 57th in the state.

This component assesses the availability and quality of communication infrastructure, such as broadband internet access, which is crucial for businesses and residents to stay connected and resilient during disruptions. Granville County's performance on this dimension is average when compared to other North Carolina counties, ranking 64th in the state.

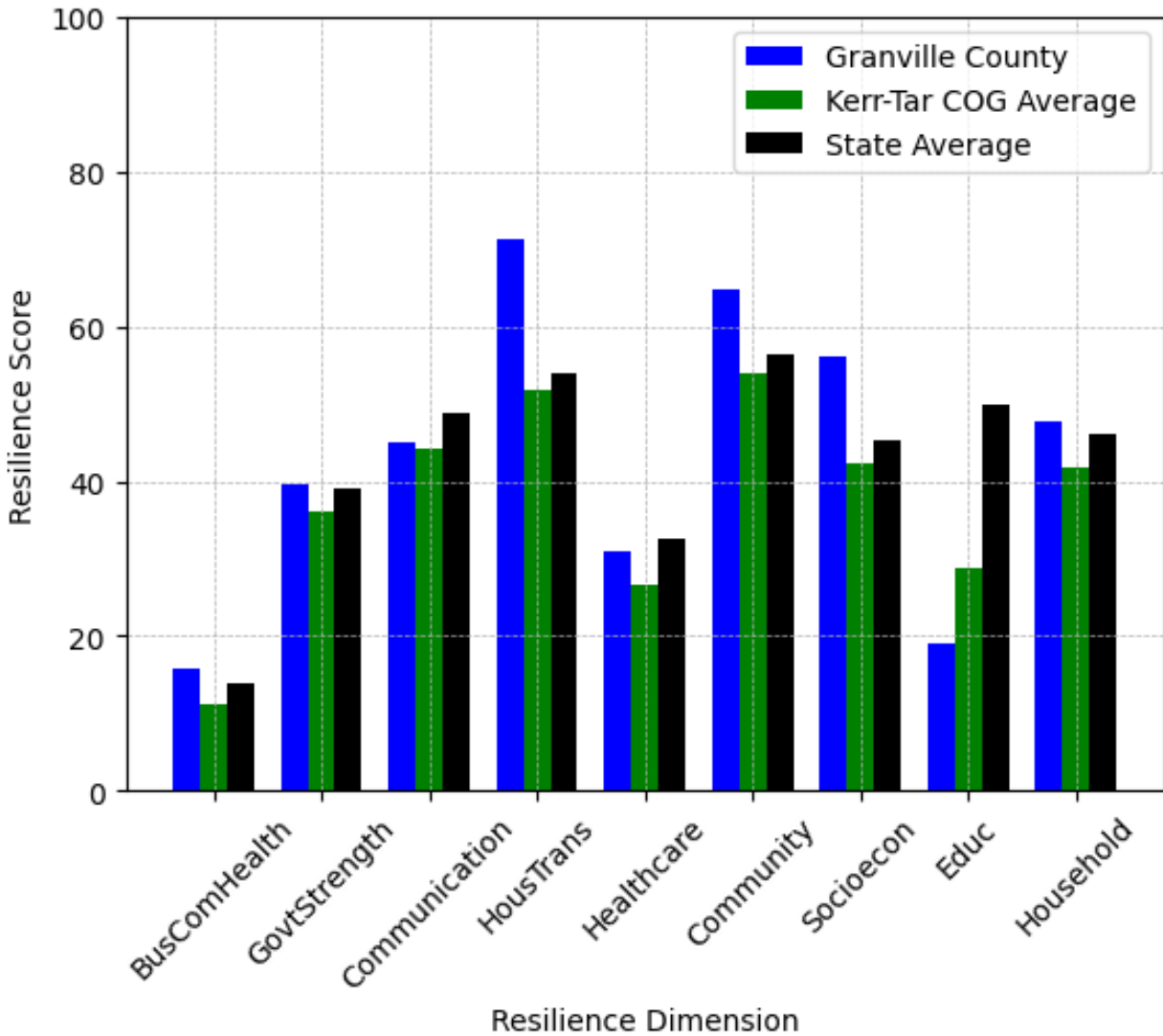
Household Characteristics: 47.85

This component examines factors such as the proportion of single-parent households, age distribution, and the proportion of individuals with disabilities, as these elements can influence a community's resilience and ability to recover from economic disruptions. Granville County's performance on this dimension is average when compared to other North Carolina counties, ranking 39th in the state.
