
Halifax County Summary

Resilience Score: 5.66

In 2022, Halifax County achieved a Resilience Score of 5.66, which is weak as compared to the North Carolina State average.

Business Community Health: 6.79

This component examines the strength and diversity of the local business community, including factors such as the number of businesses, employment levels, and industry diversity. Halifax County's performance on this dimension is fairly weak when compared to other North Carolina counties, ranking 80th in the state.

This component looks at the financial health of local governments, including their ability to generate revenue, manage debt, and maintain adequate reserves to weather economic downturns. 
