- SUBJECT: Coronavirus Relief Fund Final Monthly Report

Per Session Law 2021-1, Section 1.7.(a), the North Carolina Pandemic Recovery Office (NCPRO) is required to submit a report to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations on the Coronavirus Relief Fund allocations, disbursements, and expenditures through September 30, 2022. In accordance with US Treasury guidance and NCGA session laws, NCPRO closed out the Coronavirus Relief Funds as of September 30, 2022 and submitted the State of North Carolina's final report to the US Treasury in October 2022. Outstanding issues related to return of business loan funds are noted in the report, and NCPRO awaits further guidance from US Treasury.
